FAQs - UK PCAs

- 1. I want to supply UK newspaper content to a non-UK PCA. What are the rules?**
You may supply eClips International content (25 titles) provided the non-UK PCA has an eClips International Licence.
- 2. What if I want to supply content outside of the eClips International content set to a non-UK PCA?**
You may supply content outside the eClips International content set, provided the non-UK PCA holds a NLA standard PCA agreement as well as the eClips International Licence.
- 3. Can I provide the non-UK PCA with PDFs?**
No, you may only provide links (to eClips or your own website as applicable)
- 4. Can I supply UK newspaper content to a non-UK end user?**
Yes. You can supply eClips International content, provided the end user signs the appropriate NLA agreement. If you wish to supply content outside of the eClips International content set, the end user must have a direct UK NLA end user licence.
- 5. Can I supply an end user with PDFs?**
No, you may only provide links (to eClips or your own website as applicable)
- 6. What is eClips International going to cost me?**
eClips International is priced based on a per link per user delivered fee; €2/£1.60 (1 user) to €1.50/£1.20 (5 users) – subject to a minimum monthly fee of €125/£100.

FAQs – non-UK PCAs

- 1. I want to supply UK newspaper content to a non-UK end user. What are the rules?**
You may supply eClips International content (25 titles) provided you hold an eClips International Licence and the end user has an eClips International End User Licence.
- 2. What if I want to supply content outside of the eClips International content set to a non-UK end user?**
You may supply content outside the eClips International content set, provided you hold a NLA standard PCA agreement as well as the eClips International Licence. If you wish to supply content outside of the eClips International content set, the end user must also have a direct UK NLA end user licence.
- 3. Can I supply an end user with PDFs?**
No, you may only provide links (to eClips or your own website as applicable)

- 4. *I want to receive eClips International content from a UK PCA. What are the rules?***
You may receive eClips International content (25 titles) provided you hold an eClips International PCA Licence.
- 5. *What if I want to receive content outside of the eClips International content set from a UK PCA?***
You may receive content outside the eClips International content set, provided you hold a NLA standard PCA agreement as well as the eClips International Licence.
- 6. *Can I receive PDFs of UK content from a UK PCA?***
No, from 1 April 2009 you may only receive links (from eClips or from the UK PCAs own website as applicable)
- 7. *What is eClips International going to cost me?***
eClips International is priced based on a per link per user delivered fee; €2/£1.60 (1 user) to €1.50/£1.20 (5 users) – subject to a minimum monthly fee of €125/£100.

FAQs - non-UK end users

- 1. *Can I get UK newspaper content from my local PCA?***
Yes you can receive 25 key UK titles provided your PCA has the eClips International Licence and you sign the eClips International End User Licence.
- 2. *What happens if I need content outside the eClips International content set?***
If your PCA holds a standard NLA PCA agreement, they can provide you with additional content, provided you hold a direct UK NLA end user licence as well as the eClips International End User Licence
- 3. *Can I get UK content from a UK PCA?***
Yes, the same rules apply. You can get the eClips International set if you sign the eClips International End User Licence and wider content if you hold a direct UK NLA end user licence.
- 4. *Can I make further digital copies of what I receive?***
Yes, if you hold a direct UK NLA end user licence.
- 5. *Can I print off what I receive?***
Yes. If you have signed the eClips International End User Licence you may print off a single copy of what you receive. If you wish to print off multiple copies of eClips International content or if you wish to print off content outside of the eClips International content set you must either report them to your local RRO, (if they have an agreement with the NLA) or have a direct UK NLA end user licence.
- 6. *What is the NLA going to charge me for receiving content from eClips International?***
Your PCA will charge you for receiving links from eClips International. However if you wish to further reproduce UK newspaper content internally then this will be subject to the details above and our tariff in force at this time. FAQs - General

1. *Why are these rules for non eClips International content so complex?*

eClips International gives all the benefits of eClips with no PCA subscription cost and no digital minimum fee to users. That's a great new offer designed to simplify licensing. But we cannot afford to extend that to all eClips content, or to allow wider eClips benefits to be shared with PCAs who do not subscribe to the service, so some restrictions must apply.

2. *What other alternatives are there?*

Paper delivery and ClipSearch are two possible alternatives. ClipSearch allows non-UK PCAs and end users to access participating eClips titles direct. Paper delivery allows copies to be reported directly through local RRO (copyright body) agreements.

3. *Have you considered alternatives?*

We are interested in feedback and are open to discussion where there is adverse client impact, noting the issues above: - that eClips content cannot be shared by PCAs, and that eClips International content set breadth is limited.

4. *Who can apply for an eClips International Licence or a NLA standard PCA agreement?*

Any organisation, irrespective of where your business is based, can apply for either an eClips International Licence or a NLA standard PCA agreement

5. *What are the reporting requirements for PCAs for eClips International?*

The reporting requirements are similar to the standard PCA agreements. A monthly return must be e-mailed to the NLA (by no later than the seventh day following the end of each month) for the preceding calendar month, showing the number of Links sent to a Permitted User, by publication and title and by Client. It must also show the average number of Permitted Users for each Client in that month.
